NYC TEACHER MORGAN EVERS EARNS NEW YORK WORKING FAMILIES PARTY ENDORSEMENT

*WFP backs Evers to fight affordability crisis in 81st Assembly primary
challenge against three-decade incumbent*

BRONX, NEW YORK – NYC teacher and community organizer Morgan Evers today announced that she has earned the endorsement of the New York Working Families Party (NYWFP) for her campaign in the 81st Assembly District for the June 2026 primary challenging Jeffrey Dinowitz, who was elected to the seat in 1994.

“I’m honored to earn the WFP endorsement and proud to stand alongside the movement fighting for affordable housing, universal childcare, healthcare for all, and protecting immigrant communities,” **Evers said**. “With WFP’s support, we are ready to end more than three decades of status quo governance that’s hurting working families in the Northwest Bronx. I’m prepared to fight in Albany for working people and real, permanent solutions to the affordability crisis.”

WFP’s leadership cited Evers’ commitment to housing that New Yorkers can afford, expanding access to childcare, lowering healthcare costs, and defending immigrant communities from federal attacks.

If elected, Evers, who is visually impaired, will be the first blind woman to serve in the New York state legislature. She served as New York State Committee member for the 81st Assembly District during the 2022 to 2024 term.

The 81st Assembly District encompasses Kingsbridge, Riverdale, Spuyten Duyvil, Van Cortlandt Village, and parts of Norwood, Wakefield and Woodlawn in the Bronx.
